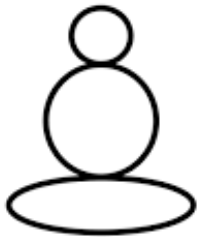

EVI October 2019 Financial Update

1. Overview - Group contributions YTD are \$2,707 (16%) over the revised budget. The revised budget assumes -10% July to year end. The increased cash position is from \$608 operating gain, plus \$415 literature sales exceeding expenses. We have \$1,200 credit outstanding with AAWS from books returned.

2. Expenses - Operating expenses were below budget, no office supplies and copier bill not received yet.

3. Group Contributions - Group contributions are strong and underscore the need for more consistent contributions from the groups.

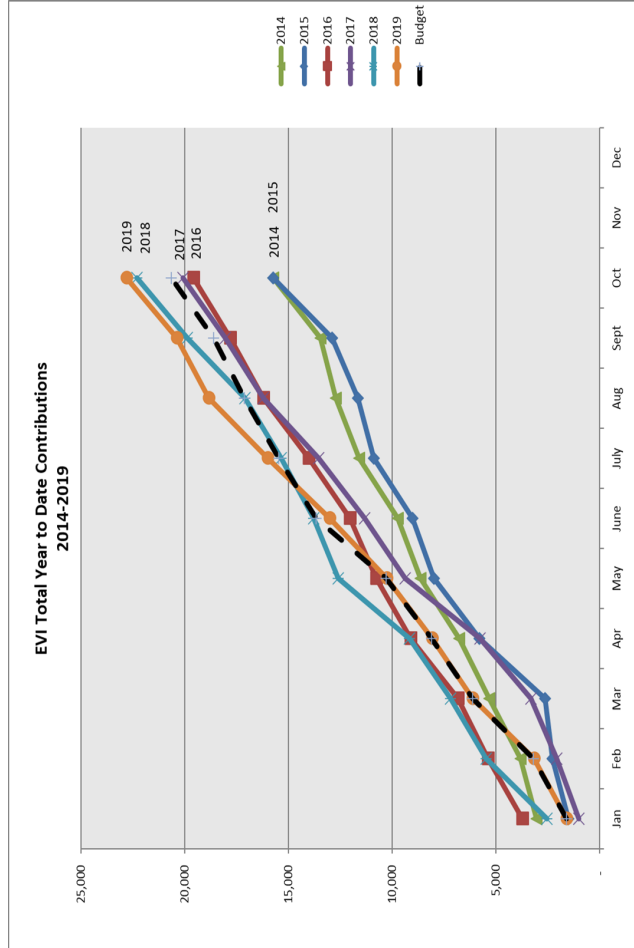
4. Committee Expenses - There was no spending by the committees in October. When the budget was reviewed with the committees it was suggested that they spend their budget by year end as we are above prudent reserve.

5. Prudent Reserve - We are above prudent reserve by \$2,140.

What it's like now.

I attend meetings. I have incredible friends in and out of recovery. I am happy to live a modest life. I pay attention. I **notice** what's going on with me and what's happening around me. I live **in the moment**. I make decisions early to head trouble off at the pass. I ask of myself that I **look for feathers rather than wait for two by fours** to hit me. The feathers are those messages that could easily pass by. The feathers are those **voices of intuition, conscience, and God shots**. The two by fours are what happens when I ignore the feathers or decide to exercise my will and not God's will. It's painful. Paying attention to feathers saves me embarrassment, damaged relationships, and not having to make amends over stupid or thoughtless actions. **2 x 4's waste time and energy and hurt me and others like hell.**

I read the literature. I **monitor my self-inflatable ego** as best I can. I try to bust that ego like a gnarly pimple and regain humility. Today I **don't push the river**. I'm no longer driven and I take life at God's pace. I readily **laugh at myself**. A sense of humor is a critical tool to my recovery. I love a meeting when people have good, hearty laughs at themselves. There are certain people that I think of for making me laugh at meetings. Like **Todd, Cress, and Jose**.

Like a friend of mine, we laugh at one of his stories. He was in Spokane, staggered into a Catholic Church, entered a confessional booth, sat down, and said nothing. The Priest coughed a few times to get his attention but my friend was so drunk that he just sat there. Finally, the Priest pounded on the wall. My friend, who was shit for brains, mumbled, **'Ain't no use knockin', there's no paper on this side either.'**

I pray and meditate. My **revision of the serenity prayer** is a combination of what I've heard from others. Frankly, most things I've said tonight I picked up from someone else. The Serenity Prayer. God, grant me the serenity to accept the people, places, and things I cannot change; the courage to change the things I can, which is only me; and the **honesty** to know the difference. I have to focus on honesty first. **It's necessary after living in denial and as a liar and a manipulator**. After I practice honesty long enough, I integrate it and it **turns into wisdom**. People tell me I'm wise. Well, if so, it's from attending the **school of hard knocks called life**, paying attention, and doing my homework. **Same school you're in**. I seek improvement rather than relief. I do the work rather than take the easy way out.

I do 10 step reviews and make **amends**. I set my sights on being objective, not exaggerating, and not letting myself off the hook. I've made lots of amends, still have some to make. I ask if I've left anything out and what I can do to make up for it. **Some people forgive me, some don't**. I've learned that some people **do not have a statute of limitations on resentments**.

The steps and traditions and the Big Book are in my **toolbox**. They've **replaced the broken compass, the worthless navigator, the masks, the hammer with the claw side down, the slippery slopes, and my fault finder**. The fellowship and group consciousness is my **Higher Power**. I am **meeting-dependent** in order to keep my toolbox stocked and refreshed. My **admiration** for folks in AA is profound. There are not enough words for the deep and abiding respect that I have for each person that stays sober today. **As an long-timer**, I rely on the newcomer to keep me sober.

Lest I make it seem otherwise – it's not been a breeze since I joined AA. Noooooo. Not a bed of roses. It gets **messy**. AA has gotten me through my own stupidity, divorce, friends and family members' deaths. Also medical issues and mental disorders. Got me through that time in 1997 with 13 years of sobriety and I found myself in front of a liquor store. Nope, not a smooth road. But it has been an **incredibly rewarding** and **life-fulfilling journey**. I've grown up.

And now, I can only hope that you have read something of **value here**.

In sum, I am **grateful** for Alcoholics Anonymous, the most successful **self-help** group in the world. I like **working the steps and studying the traditions and concepts**. I hope to **pass along freely** of what was given to me freely. I get as much out of sponsoring as those whom I sponsor. I am **grateful to have learned that my best is good enough**. I am grateful to **belong, be safe, and be with people of my kind**. Thank you for helping me stay sober today.

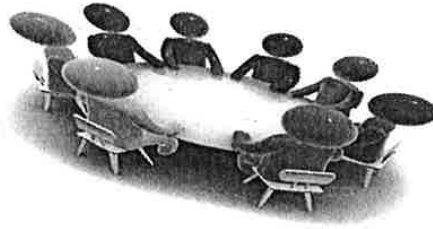

(excerpted from Grapevine, March 1953)

Without its legions of well-wishers, AA could never have grown as it has. Throughout the world, immense and favorable publicity of every description has been the principle means of bringing alcoholics into our fellowship. In AA offices, clubs and homes telephones ring constantly. One voice says "I read a piece in the newspapers...", another, "I heard a radio program...", and still another, "We saw a moving picture...", or "We saw something about AA on television..." It is no exaggeration to say that half of AA's membership has been led to us through channels like these.

The inquiring voices are not alcoholics or their families. Doctors read medical papers about Alcoholics Anonymous and call for more information. Clergymen see articles in their church journals, and also make inquiries. Employers learn that great corporations have set their approval upon us and wish to discover what can be done about alcoholism in their own firms.
