

# PORTLAND DEAF ACCESS COMMITTEE

Supporting AA Groups and Members in Carrying the Message to Deaf and Hard of Hearing Alcoholics

The Portland Deaf Access Committee (PDAC) was established in 2001 as a group of AA members who work together to help make AA in the Portland Metro Area accessible to Deaf and Hard of Hearing alcoholics. We follow the 12 Traditions of AA and are not affiliated with any other organization. Our primary purpose is to support AA groups and members in carrying the message to Deaf and Hard of Hearing alcoholics. Our work is in keeping with the guidelines from the General Service Office (GSO).

PDAC keep an up-to-date calendar of interpreted meetings and keep the sober Deaf community informed of changes. The calendar can be found at <u>pdacaa.org/meetings.htm</u>

PDAC helps AA groups carry the message to the Deaf alcoholic who still suffers. They do this by hiring professional sign language interpreters for your meeting and paying those interpreters for their service. They make sure that the interpreters who work for you are skilled, familiar with AA, and committed to anonymity. PDAC maintain a list of Deaf members available to speak at or chair your meeting. When you request a Deaf speaker we can also send an interpreter for your meeting. They also maintain a list of people willing to be sponsors to Deaf alcoholics.

PDAC relies on donations to pay for interpreting services. Contributions can be sent by mail or online: pdacaa.org

It was guestioned as to the appropriateness of sending the newsletter to outside enterprises. It was agreed that the H&I should be the ones to decide this.



# Goodbye to Eugene "Geno" Sheridan

Eugene "GENO" Philip Sheridan passed away peacefully on February 2, 2021 at Peacehealth Hospital in Vancouver, WA. Born in Bronx, NY on July3, 1936, he is preceded in death by his father Philip and mother Charlotte. Geno is survived by his 3children; Philip, Dennis and Kymber; his sister Grace, 11 grandchildren and 10 great Grandchildren. Geno was a proud member of the United States Marine Corp (OOH RA!) where he was a welder/machinest stationed in Okinawa, Japan. Always the adventurer, after serving our country he left his childhood home and in 1960 headed west to Downey CA where he met the mother of his 3 children, Barbara, and became a top salesman for Gestetner Corporation. An avid angler and hunter, he spent much of his free time in the woods or on a lake with his family and especially loved the mighty McKenzie River. He loved to share his fishing stories and there were many. So many we would often joke that his stories had stories.

Geno was a great friend and would help anyone in need whether he knew you or not. He was a respected member of Alcoholics Anonymous with over 33 years clean and sober and Geno was always willing to share his experience strength and hope with others, lend an ear and loved helping others. Always the charmer with his contagious smile and laughter, he was considered "adorable" by most who met him.

Geno was incredibly creative and talented at making things out of wood or metal. In his retirement years, when he wasn't on the river, he made and sold a great number of custom bird houses and planter boxes near Eugene's Saturday Market. It wasn't uncommon for him to jot notes from a stranger for a vision they had and he would then go home and bring it to life.

Geno loved the ocean and wanted his ashes to be buried at sea. A celebration of life will be held at a later date when the people who knew & loved him can safely gather. March 3 1947 – Nell Wing started work at Alcoholic Foundation,

415 Lexington Avenue, NYC.

## March 4

1891 – Lois W. was born.

**1947** – Nell Wing met Bill W. for the first time.

**March 5 1945** – Time Magazine reported first of a series of Detroit radio broadcasts by AA members.

**March 7 1941** – Boston newspaper reported that any drunk who wanted to get well was more than welcome at the AA meeting at 115 Newbury St., at 8 PM Wednesdays.

**March 9 1941** – Wichita Beacon reported on an AA member from NY who wanted to form a group in Wichita, KS.

March 10 1944 – New York Intergroup was established.

March 11 1949 – The Calix Society, an association of Roman

Catholic alcoholics who are maintaining their sobriety through participation in AA, was formed in Minneapolis by five Catholic AA members. March 15 1941 – First AA group in New Haven, CN, was formed. March 16 1940 – Alcoholic Foundation and Works Publishing moved from Newark to 30 Vesey St. in lower Manhattan. March 21

**1881** – Dr. Bob's wife, Anne, was born.

**1966** – Ebby T., whom Bill W. called his sponsor, died sober.

## March 22

**1951** – William Duncan Silkworth, MD, died at Towns Hospital. He helped more than 40,000 alcoholics during his lifetime.

**1984** – Clarence S., "Home Brewmeister," died at 81.

## March 23

**1936** – Bill & Lois W. visited Fitz M., "Our Southern Friend," in Maryland.

**1940** – Lois W. paid her first visit to the office on Vesey Street in NYC.

March 25 1898 – Jim B. ("The Vicious Cycle") was born.

**March 29 1943** – The Charleston Mail, WV, reported on Bill W.'s talk at St. John's Parish House.

March 31 1947 – 1st AA group formed in London, England.
