

## STARLIGHT MEDITATION MEETING

TUESDAYS AT 5:30PM - 6:30PM ON **ZOOM**Meeting ID: 749 420 421

This month marks the 6th year of the Starlight Meditation Meeting, a meeting that like most, has volve during this past year to remain alive and well and continue to serve as a resource for anyone wishing to strengthen and grow their sobriety.

The Starlight Meditation meeting began with a desire to incorporate a bit of meditation, stillness, and contemplation on readings from our A.A. literature, and in alignment with the the Step 11. Originally called the 11th Step Meditation Meeting, we created this meeting to also include an ambiance of serenity with candlelight, twinkling lights, and a rotating color spectrum light! When we were informed that there was already a meeting with a similar name, we changed the name through a group consciousness to the Starlight Meditation Meeting. It was a perfect fit. This hour-long meeting begins with reading 'How It Works', followed by a selection from the 12 &12 that refers to "meditation is our way out to the sun". A chairperson (not necessarily a homegroup member) will then choose a reading of their choice from 'As Bill See's It' and then we would spend 10 minutes in silent meditation, or contemplation on the reading. The chair will then re-read the selection and share their thoughts about it. After that, the meeting is open for sharing. Typically, this meeting, held in a smaller, upstairs conference room at St. Mary's Episcopal Church, has about 20 attendees. As time went on, we needed to bring in more chairs and have considered needing a bigger space, however much we love the intimacy and quiet of our smaller space and have been able to make it work. The beauty of doing the reading from ABSI before and again after the meditation, and then hearing the chairperson's share about the reading, is that it seems to bring such thoughtful shares after having the quiet reflection time.

When Covid -19 happened and the Pandemic became our new reality, we were able to quickly regroup to use the Zoom format, thanks to one of our member's subscriptions. We decided to limit the meditation time to 5 minutes because it felt a little awkward going longer in this format. Other than that, the meeting has maintained the same format and has continued to be a source of thoughtful and meaningful reflections on the many and varied readings in As Bill Sees It. It is always amazing to have some readings that have never been read before! Our attendance has remained robust with both the regulars and those who drop in from all over! Like many meetings on Zoom, this has been a positive side effect of this pandemic. People from out of state or wherever are able to attend and that has been a delightful aspect of this challenging time. The Starlight Meditation Meeting has been coined as 'the sweetest little meeting in town' and it does seem to have a very special energy about it. Although we look forward to the days when we can meet again in person with our twinkly lights and intimate setting, we are so grateful that we have been able to thrive and offer this weekly reprieve, and a sweet hour of the language of the heart and the sunlight of the spirit!

## **Downtown AM**7AM Everyday on **GoToMeeting**

The purpose of this meeting is to give AA members an opportunity to start their day with a rededication to sobriety and a spiritual way of life. This is not a meeting devoted so much to reliving the past as it is to developing an appropriate attitude for living this particular day successfully. <a href="Downtown AM">Downtown AM</a> is a closed meeting, which means only those who have a desire to stop drinking may attend. Homegroup members chair the meeting and choose a topic related to recovery through the AA steps and traditions from AA literature. We often read from the Daily Reflections.

Pre-Covid, <u>Downtown AM</u> used to meet in-person 6 days a week, Monday-Saturday, from 7AM-8AM. Our meeting room was in the basement of the First Christian Church on 11th & Oak. After the chair picked a topic, the meeting would split into two rooms so everyone had the opportunity to share.

Now <u>Downtown AM</u> meets online-only 7 days a week from 7AM-8AM. Since there are currently no limitations renting the church space, group conscious voted to include Sundays on our online meeting schedule. <u>DTAM</u> meets on <u>GoToMeeting</u> with audio-only. Turning off cameras and using a less popular online conference platform was an idea made by our IT trusted servants in hopes to avoid system overloads or bandwidth issues. It has been a success! Attendees often mention how calling-in or logging-in as audio-only helps them listen closer with less distractions. <u>DTAM</u> Steering and Service Meetings still occur monthly and Group Inventories happen bi-annually. Our 7th Tradition has been successfully using the PO Box mail-in option. Most service positions have adjusted to meet our new online presence. ## **AA HISTORY AROUND THE GLOBE**



## Submission by Mary C.

District 19 held their first 2021 Zoom event on Saturday and Sunday, February 6th and February 7th - AA History Around the Globe. There were presentations by eight fascinating speakers from all over the world. Last fall District 19 held a Zoom event on the History of AA in Oregon. It was so interesting and diverse that our committee decided to broaden the reach and the understanding of the evolution of Alcoholics Anonymous internationally.

One interesting share was about a seaman who sobered up at an AA meeting in Sydney in the mid-1940s and took the book to ports where ever he traveled. He eventually took it to Ireland and AA spread across Ireland (by other sources, as well), the U.K, Europe, the Southern Hemisphere and Asia. Even during WWII, many soldiers from North America brought their Big Books with them and held meetings with their own troop members or with those from other English-speaking countries.

Our speaker Simon, from Hong Kong, was discussing how they just celebrated their 50-year celebration of AA. AA started there while it was still an English Colony, but after it returned to being part of China in 1997, it wasn't as easy to get AA literature. Alcoholics from all over, delivered suitcases of new and used AA books – including our speaker from Ireland, Lila. With more than 50 years of sobriety, she recalled delivering Big Books there. Going to any lengths. Spreading the word to the alcoholic that still suffered!

Another interesting perspective was from Marcos from Brazil, who explained what it was like to try and hold an AA meeting under a dictatorship. Government officials watched for gatherings of people, thinking they were likely revolutionaries, so they had to be very cautious and careful - just to have an AA meeting. Once again, going to any lengths!

## Continued submission by Mary C.

This workshop was so rewarding in so many ways. It took more than four months of planning, finalizing the speakers, and problem solving logistical issues. We also needed to find a Spanish language translator that would be available that weekend and an American Sign Language interpreter, which we did. She did an amazing job. We got our ASL contact through the organization, Portland Deaf Access Committee for Alcoholics Anonymous (pdacaa.org). They are an autonomous AA group, not affiliated with any intergroup or GSO.

One challenge was scheduling speaker time slots. Presentations were grouped into two sessions - one on Saturday from 6pm to 8pm, and the second on Sunday from 10am to noon, Pacific Time. It worked out very well using a site called - timeanddate.com/worldclock.

The event was fun and informative with an amazing group of presenters: Valorie R. from Bend, Oregon; Darren D., Sydney, Australia; Quankui M., Beijing, China; Simon M., Hong Kong, China; Francoise H., Paris, France; Lila R., Kerry, Ireland; Marcos P., Rio De Janeiro, Brazil; and Chrissy R. North Shore, O'ahu, Hawaii. Between the two-day sessions, we had about 300 attendees and have such gratitude for those who attended and participated.

We thank Oregon Area 58 for the use of their professional Zoom account and to Oregon IT Chair Mark N. for his invaluable assistance. Our District 19 Committee members; Angie, Eugene, Caitlin, Emilee, Sharon, Sandi, and Mary are in the planning stages for our next event. We are looking for committee members to help with Outreach to the LatinX and Spanish speaking communities across the U.S. and Mexico, and someone to help reach a larger deaf alcoholic population across North America. Please let us know if anyone has interest in being involved or has a contact who could help out.

## A.A. Historical Events in the Month of *April!*

## **April 1**

**1939** – "Alcoholics Anonymous", AA's Big Book was published.

**1966** – Sister Ignatia died at the age of 77. She worked with Dr. Bob in treating many early AA members at St. Thomas Hospital in Akron.

**April 3 1941** – First Florida AA meeting was held.

April 4 1960 – The Chicago Daily News reported that Fr. Ed D., a Jesuit priest who helped start the first AA group in St. Louis, had died at age 62.

**April 7 1941** – Ruth Hock, Bill W.'s secretary, reported there were 1,500 letters asking for help, as a result of the Saturday Evening Post Article by lack Alexander

**April 10 1939** – The first ten copies of the Big Book arrived at the office Bill shared with Hank P. in Newark, New Jersey.

## April 11

**1938** – Alcoholic Foundation held its first meeting.

**1941** – Bill and Lois W. moved into their new home, Stepping Stones.

## April 12

**1942** – The Windsor Daily Star in Ontario, Canada, reported that over 400 AA's attended a testimonial dinner for Dr. Bob.

## **April 16**

**1940** – A sober Rollie H. caught the only opening day no-hitter in baseball history since 1909.

**1973** – Dr. Jack Norris, non-alcoholic Chairman of the AA General Service Board, presented President Richard Nixon with the one-millionth copy of the Big Book at the White House.

## **April 17**

**1941** – 2nd group in Los Angeles, the "Hole in the Ground Group" was formed.

## **April 19**

**1940** – First AA group in Little Rock, Arkansas, was formed.

## **April 22**

**1940** Bill W. transferred his Works Publishing Stock to the Alcoholic Foundation. The date on which Hank P. transferred his stock is uncertain.

## **April 23**

**1940** – Dr. Bob wrote the Trustees to refuse Big Book royalties, but Bill W. insisted on them for Dr. Bob and Anne.

## **April 24**

**1989** – Dr. Leonard Strong died. He was Bill's brother-in-law and a non-alcoholic AA Trustee.

## **April 25**

1951 – AA's first General Service Conference was held.

## **April 26**

**1939** – Bill & Lois W. moved in with Hank P. after the bank foreclosed on 182 Clinton St. This was the first of over 50 moves before they acquired Stepping Stones.

## April 30

**1989** – The film "My Name is Bill W.," a Hallmark Hall of Fame presentation, was broadcast at 9 p.m. on ABC TV.
