Lambda Meeting

Lambda is an open AA meeting for the LGBTQ community. In keeping with our 3rd Tradition stating, "The only requirement for A.A. membership is a desire to stop drinking," all are welcome at this meeting. Lambda was founded when a group of sober friends would meet once a month for a campfire AA meeting. At some point, the group talked about starting a weekly LGBTQ meeting. Lambda has now held meetings at First Christian Church for 12 years.



Lambda has a structured format with a monthly chairperson who finds different leaders for each Sunday. Here at the Lambda Group the first Sunday of each month is that month's Step Meeting, the second Sunday is an Open AA Discussion Meeting, the third Sunday is an AA Approved Literature, and the last Sunday is a 30 Minute Speaker and Annual Celebration Meeting. The Annual Celebration Birthday meeting is especially fun when those celebrating bring friends and family, sharing a bit of their sobriety experience, strength and hope from the past year. This last year of Zoom has changed our meeting in many ways. The group no longer has the meeting after the meeting in the church courtyard. Our greeter announces names/introductions from the Zoom windows instead of a hug or welcoming hello.

Lambda home group members have kept the meeting strong, listing Lambda Spiritual Sunday in LGBTQ sites around the country. It has been great to meet new friends from around the globe. We would also love to see more of you, so please join us Sundays at 5pm via Zoom.

Featured Meetings of the Month!

Wednesday Night Men's Stag

The <u>Eugene Wednesday Men's stag</u> meeting is one of the oldest meetings in Lane County. It started in 1954 at a member's house (Little Bruce), moved to another house, then to the Unity Church on Oak Street (the building no longer exists) and then moved to the "Friendly Street House". This was a private home in Eugene that hosted a variety of community meetings including Alcoholics Anonymous. They had an AA meeting on Thursday nights that alternated between an open meeting one week, and a closed meeting the next.



In 1954 three of the regular members (there were reported to be about 15 people working an AA program in Eugene in 1954) learned of a Men's stag (a closed meeting limited to attendance by men) in Portland, and decided to implement that model at a meeting here in Eugene. There was some controversy about this decision due to the tradition that the only requirement for membership is a desire to stop drinking. Oral historians state that there was concern that a men's only meeting would be little more than a glorified cigar club. In practice it became, and still is a meeting of men sincere about their sobriety, who actively work the steps and the principles of AA in their lives and in their fellowship and in their families. In 1968 the meeting moved to the newly built Episcopal Church of the Resurrection on Hilyard Street. It continued there every Wednesday from 8PM - 9:30PM until March, 2020 - when, due to circumstances outside of our control - the meeting moved to Zoom. We anticipate returning to the church on Hilyard Street at a time when all of our regular attendees feel that public gatherings do not put them at risk.

If you are a male, and have a desire to stop drinking we invite you to zoom by on a Wednesday at 8 PM. (Zoom ID 212982401, password 'stag'). The meeting format is that the meeting opens with the Serenity Prayer and a moment of silence. The Preamble, How it works and the 12 Traditions are read. The Chairman then shares a topic, and some readings from AA literature about that topic. After sharing, the Chair calls on members to share. On a typical Wednesday the chair has selected the topic, posted it and has called a few other members to discuss the topic in the days prior to the meeting. This gives a strong sense of topic, and related literature to the meeting. For the duration of the meeting a variety of people are called on, ranging from newcomers to old timers. This creates the sharing of experience, strength and hope - on any given Wednesday you never know who is going to say what you need to hear.

Bookkeeper report: Things continue to go "perfectly".

Special Issue:

In Person meeting guidelines/guidance — EVI is not in a position to give direction to groups and will not provide guidelines for groups. Discussed making resources regarding COVID available to groups. Chaz went around the zoom room for opinions on the so-called guideline issue. Consensus: provide information on the website. "These are things you may wish to consider ..." from the NYIG letter would be a good addition to the resources. Chaz asked the web tech's if the information could be more prominent. Suggested links to various resources. Also discussed were ways to make the title "pop". Mary and Chaz will create a something and get it to the SC for review and approval, and to Eugene by Friday so Eugene can get it on the website by Monday.

-Old business

Office Issues – Carol, Chaz – Carol reminded us of the thirty-day continual sobriety for volunteers. Also, putting any cash purchase or contribution over \$50 directly in the office "drop safe". Kudos to Carol for a great job.

Literature – Literature order came in and the shelves look so much better! Thanks Mary! Chaz and Melody put in an order for Spanish literature and we have a lot of Spanish speaking members. Mary suggested checking the pamphlets as well.

Summerfest – Chaz believes they delayed their decision as to whether it will be inperson or virtual. We hope to know by June 1st. EVI will have a panel presentation. June 21st will be a trial presentation. July 17th from 11:30am to 1pm is our time slot for Summerfest.

EVI Steering Committee minutes 5/3/2021

-New business

Office Key Holder requirements – Suggested a policy for key-holders. Carol noticed in the bylaws that there isn't any difference in requirements between the key-holders and the volunteers. There needs to be some clarity about the responsibilities of the key-holders. It was suggested that the key-holder needs to know how the office works and how to get things done. Maybe the key holder should be a service position, elected by the body. Chaz mentioned that it would be too many elections to have every key-holder be elected. A.A. Historical Events in the Month of *May!*

May 1

1939 – Lois and Bill W. left their home at 182 Clinton St., Brooklyn.

1940 – Rollie H., Cleveland Indians, anonymity break occurred.

1941 – First Wisconsin AA meeting was held in hotel in Milwaukee.

May 2

1941 – Jacksonville, FL newspaper reported the start of an AA group in Jacksonville.

1943 – *New Orleans Times* reported founding of the first Louisiana AA group with a dozen members.

May 3 1941 – First AA group formed in New Orleans, Louisiana.

May 4 1940 – *Sunday Star* reported founding of first AA group in Washington, DC.

May 6 1939 – Clarence S. of Cleveland told Dr. Bob, his sponsor, he would not be back to Oxford Group meetings in Akron and would start an "AA" meeting in Cleveland.

May 7 1956 – The first English AA Convention was held in Cheltenham, England.

May 8

1943 – Akron AA Group celebrates 8th anniversary with 500 present and sober.

1971 – Bill W. was buried in private ceremony, in East Dorset, Vermont. Dr. Jack Norris gave the eulogy.

May 10 1946 – Searcy W. had his last drink. (Searcy passed away September 30, 2003 with 57 years continuous sobriety.)

May 11

1935 – Bill W. called Walter Tunks from the Mayflower Hotel, and was referred to Henrietta Seiberling who set up a meeting with Dr. Bob.

1939 – First meeting of the Cleveland Group.

May 12 1935 – Mother's Day, Bill and Dr. Bob met for the first time, at the home of Henrietta Seiberling.

May 15 1961 – Bill W.'s mother, Dr. Emily Strobell, died.

May 16 1941 – Ruth Hock learned that the man credited with coming up with the name "Alcoholics Anonymous" has a "wet" brain.

May 17 1942 – *Dayton Journal Herald* published pictures of AA members wearing masks to protect their anonymity.

May 18

1939 – The first group to call itself A. A. is meets in Cleveland, OH.

1950 – Dr. Bob told Bill W. "I reckon we ought to be buried like other folks." He wanted no memorial.

May 19 2000 – Dr. Paul O. died at the age of 83. He was author of "Acceptance Was the Answer" in the 4th edition of the Big Book. This story was titled "Doctor, Alcoholic, Addict" in the 3rd edition.

May 29 1980 – "Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers" was published.

May 31 1938 – Bill W. and other A.A.s began writing the Big Book.
