

Seniors in Sobriety may be a little misleading as a meeting name as we are open for all. Founded by members Bill O and Jody in June of 2012 they felt with others that a format for seniors was a welcome and necessary addition to the variety of AA meetings available locally; General, Women's, Men's, Young people, LGBTQ. Besides the obvious necessity of AA, the unique issues facing seniors; health (physical and mental), employment opportunities, housing requirements, transportation, etc. These issues didn't seem to be addressed at other AA meeting.

The Campbell Senior Center was a perfect meeting place for our group. They were most accommodating for our needs even rent, only asking us to pay what and when we could. Meeting on Thursday at a senior friendly time of 3PM was decided on. When I joined about 6 years ago it was not uncommon to only have a handful of alcoholics attending. The secretary told me that he was sometimes the only attendee. Fortunately our numbers grew and we normally had between 10-14 members with about an equal number of men and women. We registered our group with GSO in 2016 and have made donations to them, Area 58 and the EVI.

This is a participation meeting with readings of the AA Preamble, How it works, Traditions, Promises and a prayer of the chairpersons choice. We work a Step on the first meeting of the month by readings in the 12 by 12. Non step meeting have a chair chosen and volunteering a topic of their choice. Members are encouraged to speak on that topic or anything of concern. We encourage newcomers into the Program recognizing their presence as being 'the most important person in the room.' Most recently the Covid19 pandemic saw the Campbell Center close its doors temporarily for renovation and remain closed because of Covid 19. We initially met outside north of the patio on the lawn. As Fall weather brought cold and worse, rain; we sought and found The First Baptist Church in Springfield willing to house our group. Covid 19 concerns kept our attendance low but we persevered with 5-6 hardcore members joined with a mixture of newcomers and AA veterans hungry for in-person meetings. I understand the Campbell Center has now reopened but as of this writing there are no plans to move back there. Years of great identification make the Center a great location for any seniors related group, we'll have to see how the members feel about this. As for now we are active in recovery and ALL ARE WELCOME!

The First Saturday Speaker meeting had its first meeting October 1, 2016. The original idea was to have a once a month speaker meeting. We would try to get speakers from outside the Eugene/Springfield area so people could hear somebody maybe they had never heard before or somebody that hadn't heard in a while. The first speaker was from Bandon and over the next several years we had speakers come from all over the Oregon, Washington, Idaho and California area. We even had a speaker come from Belfast, Ireland!

In the beginning we would open up a little before the meeting and make coffee but after a couple years we were showing up an hour and half before the meeting and had a full blown potluck. A couple times we had a BBQ in the parking lot a few hours before the meeting. So many different people have shown up to do service over the years.

We started recording the speakers, T-Mar made the CDs and Joe sold them at the meeting, Cyrus became the Raffle guy. Greg, Brian and Jeff were the Coffee/Cleanup crew. Forrest and Leaf Chaired the meeting. Zakk passed the basket. The list of people who have showed up to be of service goes on and on. The meeting started pretty small and grew bigger. The night John from Belfast Ireland shared, over 250 people showed up to hear him share experience strength and hope!

By March of 2020 it became apparent that due to COVID in person meetings would be on hold. In May of 2020 we had our first online Zoom meeting. We had 180 people login to that meeting and after the speaker there was an AA comedy and music show. In June of 2021 we had our first in-person meeting in over a year. It was great to see everybody again. The meeting is now hybrid, online and in person. The next meeting will be July 3, 2021 at the new location 2537 Game Farm Rd Springfield. 5:30pm. Hope to see you there!!



To: General Service Conference
From: Josh Eggleston, A.A. Grapevine Board Chair
Re: Preamble Revision
Date: May 28, 2021

Dear Conference Members:

Several people have asked when the revised Preamble will be seen in print. In keeping with the final advisory action of the 71st General Service Conference, the A.A. Preamble revision replacing the words "men and women" with "people" will appear in the July issue of Grapevine, and its translation will be in the July/August issue of La Viña. Both of these issues will be mailed, and posted online, on June 15, 2021. After June 15, as new Grapevine, La Viña and A.A.W.S. literature or reprints go to press, and as web pages are updated, the language will change wherever the A.A. Preamble appears.

The June issue of Grapevine was on press when the Conference requested the change, so this is the first opportunity to make the adjustment in the magazines.

We've also received a number of inquiries about whether this negatively impacts the editorial independence of Grapevine. Please remember that the Grapevine Board, Publisher and Editors discussed this topic for an entire year over a series of board meetings. Ultimately it was agreed that Grapevine has the right of decision and foundational editorial independence. We felt that such a change would affect the groups as a whole and in keeping with Tradition 4, we sought the input from those it might affect by sending the discussion to the General Service Conference.

The topic was actively discussed in groups across the United States and Canada for two years over both the 70th and 71st General Service conference panels. As a result of those conversations the Delegates of the General Service Conference passed a series of votes, in a sequence of events that culminated with the final advisory action requesting:

Revised AA Preamble

Available June 15, 2021
online & in print

"A fellowship of..."

"men and women" → "people"

"The Preamble revision replacing the words "men and women" with the word "people" be presented to the General Service Board for approval as the new revised A.A. Preamble.

Having been accepted by the General Service Board and forwarded to Grapevine for fulfillment, the Publisher and editorial staff at A.A. Grapevine went to work to carry out the will of the Conference with love and service.

I hope you are all having a wonderful experience reporting out the results of the 71st General Service Conference and thank each of you so very much for your dedicated service.

A.A. Historical Events in the Month of *June!*

June 1 1949 - Anne S., Dr. Bob's wife, died.

June 4 2002- Caroline K., author of "Drinking: A Love Story" died sober of lung cancer.

June 5 1940 – Ebby T. took a job at the NY Worlds Fair.

June 6 1979 – AA gave the two-millionth copy of the Big Book to Joseph Califano, then Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare. It was presented by Lois W., Bill's wife, in New York.

June 7 1939 – Bill and Lois W. had an argument, the first of two times Bill almost slipped.

June 10 1935 – The date that is celebrated as Dr. Bob's last drink and the official founding date of AA. There is some evidence that the founders, in trying to reconstruct the history, got the date wrong and it was actually June 17.

June 11

1945 – Twenty-five hundred attend AA's 10th Anniversary in Cleveland, Ohio.

1969 – Dr. Bob's granddaughter, Bonna, daughter of Sue S. and Ernie G. (The Seven Month Slip in the First Edition) killed herself after first killing her six-year-old child.

June 13 1945 – Morgan R. gave a radio appearance for AA with large audience. He was kept under surveillance to make sure he didn't drink.

June 16 1938 – Jim B., "The Vicious Cycle" in Big Book, had his last drink.

June 18 1940 – One hundred attended the first meeting in the first AA clubhouse at 334-1/2 West 24th St., New York City.

June 19 1942 – Columnist Earl Wilson reported that NYC Police Chief Valentine sent six policemen to AA and they sobered up. "There are fewer suicides in my files," he commented.

June 21 1944 – The first Issue of the AA Grapevine was published.

June 24 1938 – Two Rockefeller associates told the press about the Big Book "Not to bear any author's name but to be by 'Alcoholics Anonymous.'"

June 25 1939 – The New York Times reviewer wrote that the Big Book is "more soundly based psychologically than any other treatment I have ever come upon."

June 26 1935 – Bill D. (AA #3) entered Akron's City Hospital for his last detox and his first day of sobriety.

June 28 1935 – Dr. Bob and Bill W. visited Bill Dotson at Akron's City Hospital.

June 30 1941 – Ruth Hock showed Bill W. the Serenity Prayer and it was adopted readily by AA.
