# **Occasional Inspiration**



Bill and Neil were two older gents who were good friends and shared a love of sobriety. The Men's Vintage Meeting focused on reading the Big Book, Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers and Pass It On. In time, Bill and then Neil passed. The remaining men kept the intent and spirit of the meeting alive and eventually started a mixed meeting on Wednesday nights with a focus on Grapevine articles. It took some time, but eventually women started attending regularly and the Vintage Group was a reality. A year or so later, a solitary Sunday night Big Book study meeting was absorbed into the group.

During Covid, like many groups, we relied on zoom to safely share the message of sobriety with each other. A group conscience was later taken to start meeting in person with a zoom option. This hybrid platform lasted several months. At present, we now meet in person only on Wednesday 7pm at Friendly Street Church, Sunday 7pm at McNail-Riley house and the men's meeting, as from the beginning, meets Tuesday noon at McNail-Riley house. **Approve Agenda** - (attachment) *Motion made and seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried.*


