The Emerald Valley Intergroup is alive and well. Despite "these uncertain times" we continue to have our office open to the fellowship and the public 7 days a week and have maintained our phone line for alcoholics reaching out for help. Our Meeting Guides Committee has been extra keen on getting the most accurate information on meeting changes uploaded to our website *eviaaweb.org* which also feeds the Meeting Guides app. A totally unscientific survey shows about ½ of the meetings in the EVI area are Zoom and ½ are in person.

Motion: EVI will adhere to the following policy regarding contributions.

- · Only contributions from AA members and AA groups will be accepted.
- Individual AA members can contribute up to \$500 annually.
- Bequests are limited to \$1,000 per Individual
- There will be no limit to registered AA Group contributions.
- Contributions or bequests that contain any obligation whatever will be declined or returned.
- Non-monetary and In-kind contributions will be accepted following the guidelines above.
- Changes and or exceptions to this policy must be announced at least one month in advance and be approved by a 2/3rds majority of voting members attending a regular EVI Business meeting in which a quorum is present.

Intent Purpose: To establish a contribution policy in light of an AA member requesting to place a bequest for EVI in their will. There is a desire to follow the General Service Office policy which follows:

"Currently, non AA members are not permitted to donate. Only members may donate, and can do so individually at up to \$5000 per year.

Bequests are limited to \$10,000/individual. If a group wants to donate in memory for the deceased, there is no limit to how much can be donated."
