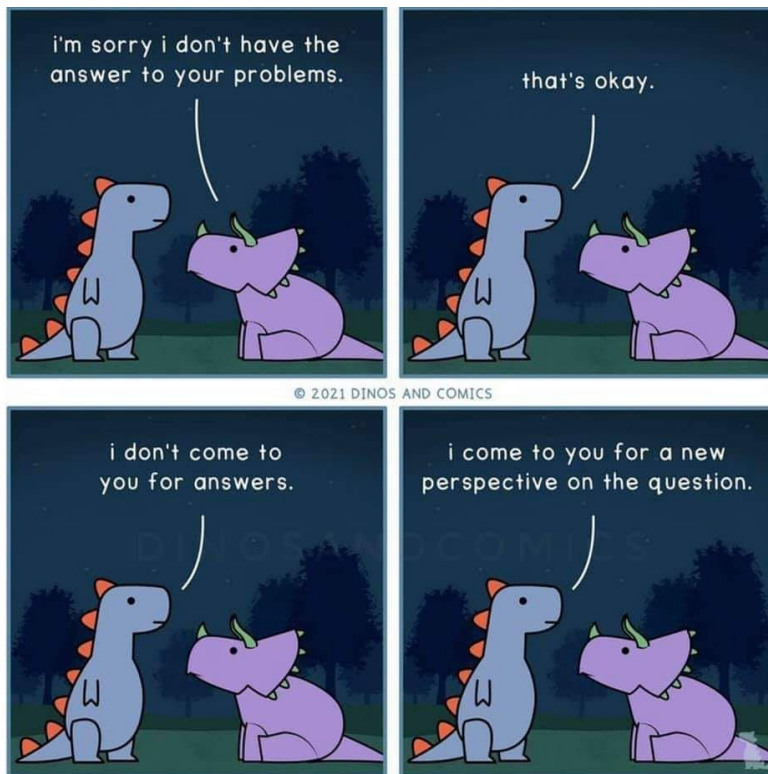

Tradition Nine:

“A.A., as such, ought never be organized; but we may create service boards or committees directly responsible to those they serve.”

Special service boards and committees. The General Service Conference, the board of trustees, and group committees cannot issue directives to A.A. members or groups. A.A.'s can't be dictated to—individually or collectively. Absence of coercion works because unless each A.A. follows suggested Steps to recovery, he signs his own death warrant. Same condition applies to the group. Suffering and love are A.A.'s disciplinarians. Difference between spirit of authority and spirit of service. Aim of our services is to bring sobriety within reach of all who want it.

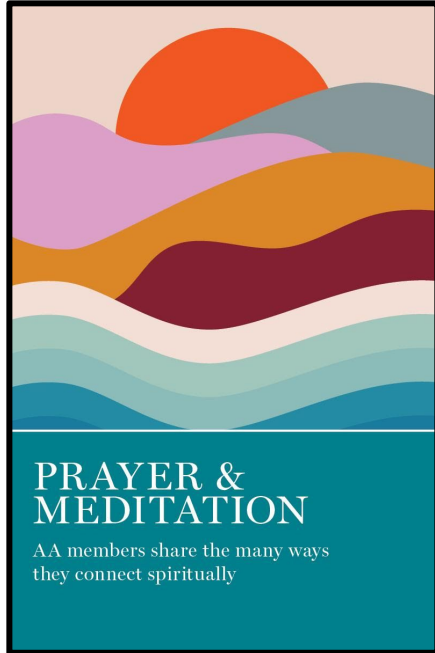

I am currently serving as Chair of the Emerald Valley Intergroup Committee (EVI). EVI comprises the territory of Districts 6, 19 and 20, along with several meetings in Linguistic District 34.

The Emerald Valley Intergroup is alive and well. Despite "these uncertain times" we continue to have our office open to the fellowship and the public 7 days a week and have maintained our phone line for alcoholics reaching out for help. Our Meeting Guides Committee has been extra keen on getting the most accurate information on meeting changes uploaded to our website eviaaweb.org which also feeds the Meeting Guides app. A totally unscientific survey shows about 1/2 of the meetings in the EVI area are Zoom and 1/2 are in person.

Our office at 2160 West 11th, Suite I in Eugene is feeling more like home every day thanks to our office volunteers and our Office Volunteer Coordinator, Carol B.. We have Chair or Vice-Chair positions filled for nearly all our committees and Intergroup meetings have been well attended.

Our Hospitals and Institutions Committee is ramping back up as several more facilities are providing Zoom AA meetings and a couple even allowing safe socially-distanced indoor AA meetings. Our literature inventory is well supplied, having elected a Literature Chair, Monica P. who's doing a super job keeping books on the shelves.

We made a big change, our Intergroup now meets via Zoom every 3rd Monday at 6:30pm. Our Steering Committee now meets on the 2nd Monday of the month at 6:30pm. EVI Contribution Policy V-3

Motion: EVI will adhere to the following policy regarding contributions.

- Only contributions from AA members and AA groups will be accepted.
- Individual AA members can contribute up to \$500 annually.
- Bequests are limited to \$1,000 per Individual.
- There will be no limit to registered AA Group contributions.
- Contributions or bequests that contain any obligation whatever will be declined or returned.
- Non-monetary and In-kind contributions will be accepted following the guidelines above.
- Changes and or exceptions to this policy must be announced at least one month in advance and be approved by a 2/3rds majority of voting members attending a regular EVI Business meeting in which a quorum is present.

Intent Purpose: To establish a contribution policy in light of an AA member requesting to place a bequest for EVI in their will. There is a desire to follow the General Service Office policy which follows:

"Currently, non AA members are not permitted to donate. Only members may donate, and can do so individually at up to \$5000 per year.

Bequests are limited to \$10,000/individual. If a group wants to donate in memory for the deceased, there is no limit to how much can be donated."

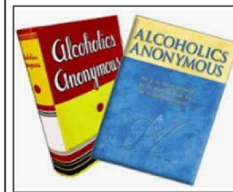

Sept 13 1937 – Florence R, first female in AA in NY.

Sept 13 1941 – WHJP in Jacksonville, FL airs Spotlight on AA.

Sept 17 1954 – Bill D, AA #3 dies.

Sept 18 1947 – Dallas Central Office opens its doors.

Sept 19 1965 – The Saturday Evening Post publishes “Alcoholics Can Be Cured Despite AA”
